The Interagency Security Classification Appeals Panel (ISCAP), established under section 5.3 of Executive Order 13526, titled "Classified National Security Information," has reached its decision on the mandatory declassification review appeal filed by Erik Larson for a document in 9/11 Commission records in the custody of the Center for Legislative Archives at the National Archives and Records Administration. The ISCAP voted to declassify additional information in the appeal. Enclosed is a chart that describes the appeal and outlines the ISCAP decision. If you would like to review the information that the ISCAP voted to declassify, please contact your liaison to the ISCAP, David Mengel, or the ISCAP staff.

An agency head has the authority to appeal an ISCAP decision to the President in accordance with section 5.3(f) of Executive Order 13526. The 60-day appeal period under section 2003.13 of the ISCAP bylaws (32 C.F.R. Part 2003) will start on the date of this letter. Please provide information about any additional statutory withholding to the ISCAP staff before the conclusion of the 60-day appeal period, at which time, the ISCAP staff will prepare the documents for public release.

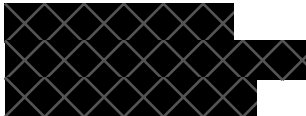
